

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is asking for public comment from all Placitans, New Mexicans, and any US communities on

the Proposed West-Wide Energy Corridor's associated BLM Resource Management Plan Updates (RMP). There are many options for the 5000 acre Placitas BLM, each of which will shape the future of Placitas (see map and survey on back for more info/options, please fill out the survey and send it in if you have not already done so).

Both the Energy Corridor and the Highway Corridor would not only pass through the BLM, they would also continue on through Placitas consuming Placitas homes & neighborhoods, and disrupting the rural atmosphere for those remaining. Please see the schedule of public meetings below and attend if at all possible. The complete BLM RMP four year timeline was posted at the Placitas Public meeting and at the BLM website.

It is WHOA's premise that having an official Wild Horse Park (state or federal) will increase the property values long-term for all property owners in Placitas. That Heritage Tourism accounts for 81% of all tourism and that tourism is the 2nd largest industry in the US and in NM. NM Tourism is a 2.5 Billion dollar industry, as per the BLM, and is an integral component of Rural Economic Development.

Komadina Passes NM Wild Horse Park Bills

Requests Fiscal Analysis for the Placitas-area BLM

Please thank SENATOR KOMADINA for his continued leadership and championship of this cause for Placitas & the State of NM

This legislative session NM State Senator Komadina successfully carried 2 more bills for WHOA requesting the State to perform a fiscal analysis by the NM State Parks Department on the acquisition (without purchase cost) of the Placitas BLM lands for preservation, as the NM Wild Horse State Park, under the federal Public Parks and Purposes Act. To help accomplish this, WHOA has secured a nationally renowned herd management specialist and an Environmental company to assist in the analysis and planning for this option.

The **Back-up Plan** to a Wild Horse Park includes keeping the BLM an open space, as an ACEC, or by withdrawing it from all permit processes, etc.
