You e-mails of June 23, 2008, to David Mathews and Mike Springfield seeking to review public records related to the canceled plan for a secondary access for the Placitas area have been forwarded to me.

Regarding the first part of your request, no phone logs exist of callers who contacted Sandoval County regarding the once-considered corridor or comments concerning current vehicle traffic in the Placitas area.

The second part of your request seeks to inspect all "maps and correspondence and telecom notes" between the County and BLM regarding BLM's resource management plan update for units 1-5.

The only document in Sandoval County's possession that responds to your request is the information that Mr. Springfield submitted to BLM on April 24, 2008. A copy of that electronic submission is enclosed. Please note the County's record of that submission contains only the data that was entered into an electronic BLM form, and not the form itself, which may be available from BLM. <TextField1>Sandoval County would be interested in working with the BLM in trying to establish right-of-way for a secondary road to northern Placitas and possibly all the way to State Highway 14. A portion of that road would cross BLM land (in the Placitas area) if possible. We believe a secondary access way is vital to the health, safety, and general welfare of the community as a whole. As you are aware, State Road 165 is over capacity, especially as it intersects Interstate 25. A second roadway would help alleviate this saturated intersection. Also, S. R. 165 is the only route out of the area in case of emergency evacuation. We are also believe that it would be in the BLM's interest to provide an acceptable access facility to the BLM's property itself. We are also interested in working with the BLM in trying to establish right-of-way in the RIO Puerco itself. Specifically, we are interested in providing a connection between State Road 550 and the Northwest Loop. We belive this is vital to reduce future congestion

in the S.R. 550 and Interstate 25 intersection, and would provide a vital connection for residents of N.W. Sandoval County to a large scale employment center we are planning along the Loop. This facility would also provide access to strategically located BLM property in the area. Thank you for your consideration of these comments, and hope to work with you regarding these matters.
